2. Withdrawal from Capital Computer Reserve.

RESOLUTION 76 2/2005

WHEREAS, the Village of Spencerport previously established a computer reserve fund known as "Capital Computer Reserve" on April 7, 1999 pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-c of the General Municipal Law for the purpose of financing the cost of acquisition of new and updating existing computer hardware, software and related technical and professional services deemed necessary by the Village Board, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Spencerport deems it necessary to upgrade our financial computer system from such reserve an amount not to exceed \$ 16,000.00 for the purpose of making certain upgrades to our financial computer system.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Village Treasurer be and is hereby directed to remove from the Capital Computer Reserve established April 7, 1999, an amount not to exceed \$ 16,000.00 for payment of costs for certain upgrades to our financial computer system.
