APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion was made by Trustee Rauber, seconded by Trustee Granger and carried that the minutes of the regular meeting held May 3, 2006 be approved as read.

PRIVILEGE OF FLOOR

Mr. Powell addressed the board to request a status report regarding his requests at the April 2006 board meeting for sidewalks to be installed along Nichols and S. Union Street and any other areas that do not currently have sidewalks. Mr. Powell continued that he concerned about the lack of sidewalks on Nichols and S. Union Street because of the heavy traffic on those streets. Mr. Powell stated that the Village has purchased new trucks, sweepers, etc., made repairs to the village office and relocated village equipment but have not added any new sidewalks.

Mr. Powell also stated that he is concerned that someone will get hurt on the broken steps on Martha Street along side of the railroad tracks.

Mayor Walker responded that no additional funds were allocated in the 2006-2007 budget for new sidewalks due to the increased spending on road repair, although funds are in place for sidewalk repair.

Mr. Powell responded that the budget should contain a provision for 1 mile of sidewalks per year.

Mayor Walker continued that the stairs on Martha Street are owned by the railroad company and little can be done about their condition.

Superintendent West stated that he will barricade off the steps with a sign stating "sidewalk closed".

Mr. Powell stated that the Village continues to ignore businesses that leave their "A" frame signs outside over night.

Trustee Rauber stated that he will contact Kevin Kelly, Village Code Enforcement Officer, about the possibility of conducting a night patrol and speaking to the businesses that are in violation of that law.

Mr. Powell thanked the board for allowing him to speak.

Mayor Walker thanked Mr. Powell for continuing to be proactive resident and bringing items to the attention of the board.

Mrs. Patricia Unvericht of 36 Pinecrest Drive addressed the board regarding a legal notice posted regarding a possible zoning variance for her neighbors at 26 Pinecrest Drive to install a fence in the drainage easement. Mrs. Unvericht continued that they were required to install the drainage on 26 Pinecrest drive and that it was costly. Mrs. Unvericht's understanding is that the board would have to approve the installation of the fence in the easement and is requesting that the board not allow the installation of the fence for fear that it might hinder or stop the flow of water.

Mayor Walker responded that the Village Board does not want any structures built within the utility easements.

Attorney Olson stated that he addressed a letter to the zoning board chair requesting that no structures to be built in a utility easement.

Joan Quigley questioned who is digging and repairing Union Street north of the bridge.

Tom West responded the Monroe County Water Authority.

Sewers Committee – Trustee Rauber, Chairman

Trustee Rauber did not have a flow report for the month of April. The resolution to approve borrowing for WWTP Force-Main Project was tabled due to not having a 2/3 majority for voting.

Mayor Walker stated that planning continues regarding the WWTP Force-Main project.

That the Village Treasurer be and is hereby directed to remove from the Capital General Reserve Fund established on April 3, 1984, an amount not to exceed \$42,500.00 for the payment of budgeted equipment for use by the Village of Spencerport.
