#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion was made by Trustee Rauber, seconded by Trustee Hopson and carried that the minutes of the regular meeting held October 3, 2007 be approved as read.

Motion was made by Trustee Rauber, seconded by Trustee Nellis-Ewell and carried that the minutes of the workshop meeting held October 17, 2007 be approved as read.

#### PRIVILEGE OF FLOOR

Mr. Powell addressed the Board by thanking Tom West for the installation of the sidewalks in front of Fairfield Cemetery on Union Street.

Mr. Powell continued by referring the article in the most recent Suburban News regarding to the sidewalks in Churchville. Mr. Powell asked why this Village cannot do the same thing.

Discussion ensued regarding sidewalks and cost.

## Andrew and Cathi Squires appeal to Spencerport Village Board

Mr. Martin, attorney for Mr. and Mrs. Squires addressed the board by distributing a packet of information including the following: Instrument survey map of the Squires property, a map of the subdivision, easement agreements, text of Village law 1 of 2007, Squires' building permit application, August 2007 letter from Jack Linder, Tom West and Jack Crooks, Squires' September 2007 response letter, September 2007 response letter form Linder, West and Crooks, Squires September 2007 letter appealing the denial.

Mr. Martin explained to the board that Mr. and Mrs. Squires are appealing the denial to their request for a building permit for a fence.

Mr. Martin continued by explaining the intention of the easement that the Village owns on their property. Mr. Martin explained that the Fence Law indicates that the Village discourages the placement of fences in easements but does not prohibit them.

Mr. Martin explained the dimensions of the Squires' lot and indicated that the easement is approximately 33% of area of their rear yard. This area is to confine the Squires' two Labrador retrievers.

Mr. Martin explained that the Squires' application was denied due to the absence of a full mechanical drawing of the property illustrating the addition of the fence. Mr. and Mrs. Squires do not feel that a full mechanical drawing is necessary for the fence application thus the need for the appeal.

Mayor Walker commented that the intent of the request of additional information was to get a feel of the construction of the fence and possible weight of the removable panels as well as a reference of what was to be built to compare to the finished product.

Mr. Martin indicated that the request for more information also included letters from the other utilities (Frontier Telephone and Time Warner Cable) indicating permission for the fence. Mr. Martin continued that those requested were not part of the law.

Mayor Walker commented that he does not feel that the request for permission from Frontier Telephone and Time Warner Cable were necessary.

Mr. Squires added that it is difficult to establish the weight of the fence prior to construction. Mr. Squires added that 10' panels will be installed on pins to allow adequate access to the utility easements.

Trustee Marello questioned the size of the removal panels.

Mr. Squires indicated that there will be (2) 10' removable panels allowing access to the 20' easement.

Mayor Walker indicated that this was the flavor of the request for more information.

Mr. Martin inquired as to whether the Village Board was receptive to a fence in the outlined location based on the previously submitted design?

Trustee Nellis-Ewell questioned if there is a list of required information.

Trustee Marello questioned if the fence would be chain link?

Mr. Squires indicated that it would be.

Discussion ensued regarding previously requested information and conversations.

Trustee Marello offered his apologies that this issue could not be worked out prior to the need for this appeal.

Trustee Rauber indicated that during the month of September 2007 the WWTP had flows of 446 thousand gallons with 2.27" of precipitation and October 2007 had flows of 536 thousand gallons with 3.89" of precipitation. Trustee Rauber deferred comments regarding the WWTP project to Mayor Walker.

Trustee Rauber indicated that he, Superintendent West and Trustee Hopson met with the Town of Ogden officials to determine a course of action for shared services when the WWTP is offline.

Mayor Walker explained that the crossing of Long Pond Road will be open cut and completed in about two days. The construction of the pump station continues and completion and restoration of Cottage Street continues and will be completed by Thanksgiving. Mayor Walker further explained that exploratory drilling is being completed to determine the size of the obstacle hindering the gravity sewer bore under the canal.
