Public Hearings

Mayor Lobene opened the public hearing for Local Law 6/2009 at 7:05 p.m.

Mayor Lobene explained that due to a petition being submitted to the Village Board by the residents of Prospect Street requesting a stop sign at Parkhurst Drive and Prospect Street.

Mrs. Ammering explained that people using Prospect Street as a "through street" drive very fast and the residents felt that a stop sign would slow them down.

Mayor Lobene closed the public hearing at 7:07 p.m.

Trustee Rauber indicated that he is happy that this issue is being resolved.

Trustee Gunther and Mayor Lobene agreed that the stop sign is a good idea.

PRIVILEGE OF FLOOR

Mrs. Quigley asked Superintendent West if a stop sign should be installed in the parking lot behind Abbotts to East Avenue.

Superintendent West responded that there has never been a stop sign there.

Mrs. Quigley continued that it is a bit dangerous. Mrs. Quigley asked if the cross walk lines could be green so that the signs could be removed.

Superintendent West indicated that NYS would have to determine if the cross walk lines could be green.

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Mrs. Quigley asked if the merchants could be asked to pick up outside of their businesses to help keep the Village looking nice.

Sewers Committee – Trustee Rauber, Chair

Trustee Rauber indicated that a kick off meeting was done with MRB to starting getting ready for the boring under the canal to take place in November of this year. Trustee Rauber continued that this attempt will be an open bore method to determine what is blocking the head of the drill and to complete the crossing. In addition a meeting with the contractor was accomplished to review the scope of work.

Trustee Rauber informed the Board that the conditions of the sewers on Prospect are in need of repair. The cost of the repair will be funded from the sewer reserve fund.

That the Village Treasurer be and is hereby directed to remove from the Sewer Fund Capital Reserve Fund an amount not to exceed \$45,000 for payment of repairing a portion of the sanitary sewer on Prospect Street.

Clerk Sullivan requested executive session to discuss a personnel issue.

Clerk Sullivan indicated that she is happy to announce that the office is fully staffed and running smoothly. Karen Kimbler is working hard to get her arms around the treasurer's duties and Pam Gilbert is working hard in the electric billing department. Pam was able to get a complete billing out and is now working on the meter exchange program and collecting on past due accounts.

Mayor Lobene commented that it is nice to hear Pam's voice welcoming customers into the office.

Superintendent of Public Works – Thomas M. West

Superintendent West commented on the following items:

- Potential to purchase a speed measuring device at a discounted price between \$2500 and \$3500 from Northern Supply.
- Prospect Street sewer work will be starting next Thursday, July 9th. Because the Village is completing a portion of the project a \$20,000 saving will be realized.
- Hillside Drive is nearing completion and milling & paving will take place late August.
- Union Street is on schedule but work will not be done during Canal Days.
- Bulk pick-up is next week.
- Contract will be signed this week to discard the brush pile
- Work continues to have Gollel to rebuild the pump station on Ballard Avenue.

Whereas, this action is a "Type II" action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and 6NYCRR615.5(c)(16) and not subject to review pursuant to SEQRA; and

Whereas, the notice of this hearing was duly published and posted as required by law;

Now, therefore, be it resolved:

Section 1. That the Village Board of the Village of Spencerport hereby enacts Local Law #4/2009 "A Local Law to Establish Stop Signs at the Intersection of Prospect Street and Parkhurst Drive in The Village of Spencerport"

Section 2. That the Village Clerk is ordered to publish a legal notice indicating the adoption of this Local Law as required by law and to file a copy of this Local Law with New York State as required by law.

Section 3. That this Local Law shall take effect as provided by law.

Section 4. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.
