Trustee Penders summarized the use of fatigue time throughout the last year by each department to include three occasions that SME implemented fatigue time; approximately twice in the DPW and once by the Office Staff. Trustee Penders indicated that the written policy should continue as written.

Trustee Penders suggested that SME and DPW crews consider working ten hours days during the summer months. The reasoning behind this suggestion was potentially save funds regarding overtime, energy and fuel.

Superintendent McIntee indicated that he reviewed the electric usage for the facilities and determined the savings for shutting down on Fridays to be approximately \$400 per month.

Mayor Lobene indicated that most of the men have young families and that ten hour days may not work for their families.

Trustee Penders continued that Superintendent West indicated that the ten hour days would allow longer time for projects during the day.

Superintendent West added that he estimated that there would be a cost savings of \$1110.00 per month in overtime costs.

Trustee Penders indicated that services normally on Fridays would be moved to Thursdays such as cardboard pick up and street sweeping. Recycling and garbage pick-up times would not be changed and during holiday weeks employees would work a five day week. Trustee Penders acknowledged that some employees may have family

conflicts and those with conflicts can use their accrued time-off. Trustee Penders suggested that a one month trial period for the ten hour days with a review of the plan on July $23^{\rm rd}$.

Mayor Lobene indicated that longer days during the hot weather may not be good. Mayor Lobene added that two employees came to her not in favor of the ten hour days.

Trustee Hopson questioned Superintendent West if there is ever a time that he had to send the employees home due to weather conditions and that everyone works the proposed 4 day week and what would be the cost if staff had to be called in for an emergency.

Superintendent West responded that those situations can happen now with the current summer hours.

Trustee Hopson responded that he feels that the Village provides a public service and responsible to work five days and that he has check other towns and villages and they all work five days a week and that it could be a disadvantage due to potential overtime costs and that Spencerport should not be setting a precedence for working four ten hour days.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell indicated that this is a program only for the shop not the office, it is top down initiative, there is no insurance savings and that studies has shown that after an eight hour shift employees are less productive. Trustee Nellis-Ewell added that one less summer employee would save as much money as the ten hour day program.

Trustee Granger added that the cost savings could be moved to off-set health care costs.

Treasurer Kimbler explained that financial reports indicate that all funds are in favorable positions. General Fund balance will be used for special projects and that the additional balance is used to cover the annual financial shortages in the electric fund and that there is possibly some surplus funds in the General Fund. The Sewer Fund is also favorable and that surplus funds will be used to lower the capital fee.

Trustee Penders questioned if the OSC is aware that the General Fund surplus is used to supplement the Electric Fund with short term loans.

Treasurer Kimbler commented that the grant that was written for the study to expand the Trolley Depot was not approved and that the Board could choose to fund that project with General Fund balance.

Mayor Lobene questioned if the plan could be paid for by the fund balance.

Treasurer Kimbler responded that yes it could be funded with the fund balance.

Trustee Granger questioned the why the bridge tenders building was out.

Treasurer Kimbler responded that the plan would include the bridge tenders building.

Trustee Granger commented that he was under the impression the Trolley Depot was to be self-sufficient.

Clerk Sullivan responded that the Village owns the building and is responsible for potential expansion and maintenance on the building.

Trustee Hopson questioned if \$30,000 is a necessary amount to find out if the project can be done.

Treasurer Kimbler responded that it is a necessary cost to determine if the expansion is feasible.

-Trustee Hopson added that if the expansion cannot be done the \$30,000 would be lost.

Mayor requested that the Board members develop a list of potential projects for grant applications and future funding.

Treasurer Kimbler reviewed the current projects and future projects and funding of these projects.

Mayor Lobene indicated that she has been in contact with Tim Carr from Cardinal Landscaping to provide plantings for the top of the remaining railroad bridge abutments. Mayor Lobene indicated that the cost of low maintenance shrubbery for the area would be \$2,810.00. Mayor Lobene added that the Canal Days Committee would donate \$1,000 towards the project and the Village would pay the difference.
