Treasurer Kimbler explained that while the Village of Spencerport has had a long term relationship with most recently Key Bank previously HSBC Bank Key Bank has instituted a new policy starting February 2014 of charging our municipal accounts services charges totaling and estimated cost of \$10,235.

Treasurer Kimbler presented a comparison of services between Key Bank and M&T Bank. The Village has an established relationship with both banks, Key Bank holds all of the Village's operating accounts and M&T hold the Village's clearing account; both banks are FDIC insured and fulfill the Village's collateralization requirements; both banks offer checking and money market savings accounts at an interest rate of 0.1%; Key Bank offers a CD at a rate of 1.0% for 27 months for \$500K or more; M&T offers a CD at a rate of 0.05% for 7 days to 1 year; both banks offer online banking.

Treasurer Kimbler continued that it is M&T's corporate policy to waive fees for government accounts, M&T will be providing the first order of all checks; M&T does require that persons cashing checks even those drawn on M&T Bank must have an account with M&T (Key Bank will cash VOS checks without the need for the individual cashing the check to have an account). Treasurer Kimbler continued that there will be some transition issues accounts will need to be established, signature cards and access policies will need to be completed. Payroll, credit card, direct debit and Town of Ogden deposit processes will need to be updated.

Trustee Granger asked Treasurer Kimbler's opinion regarding changing banks.

Treasurer Kimbler responded that \$10,000 is \$10,000

Trustee Nellis-Ewell questioned if the no fee policy was ongoing or a "teaser/loss leader" program.

Treasurer Kimbler responded that it is not however if the interest rates increase charges at Key Bank will be offset by interest income.

Clerk Sullivan clarified Trustee Nellis-Ewell's question regarding fees and that Treasurer Kimbler did confirm with M&T and while M&T could not give a firm time from they did indicate that they have not charged fees to government accounts and do not anticipate charging in the future.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell confirmed that all of our funds are insured. Treasurer Kimbler and Attorney Olson explained that funds are insured through FDIC and government securities for the full amount and statements are received regularly per NYS law.

Trustee Granger confirmed that the CD would be an offset to the fees at Key Bank and could the money be moved and still invest in the CD.

Treasurer Kimbler responded that is not an option.

Trustee Granger questioned the length of the process.

Treasurer Kimbler responded approximately 60 days and that payroll and credit card processing would take the longest.

Trustee Penders questioned how many CDs the Village has at this time.

Treasurer Kimbler responded that the Village currently does not have any CDs.

Clerk Sullivan reported that the Village's electronic recycling program has grown from 2012 to 2013 by 2 ½ times. Revenues are up as well and now because of our volume SunnKing picks up the recycling instead of the Village employees transporting recycling.

Clerk Sullivan continued by questioning the Village Board members if they were interested in bidding out insurance agents.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell indicated that she would be interested in shopping for insurance agencies.

Superintendent of Public Works - Thomas M. West

Superintendent West commented that crews have done a fantastic job on snow removal and all other operations during the excessive snow and cold temperatures. Superintendent West commented that despite news report regarding salt the Village has enough salt and will continue to be able to receive salt. Monroe County is moved to single

stream recycling meaning that it no longer needs to be separated, this will save time and equipment for the Village's service.

Superintendent McIntee explained the increased cost of supplemental power need during the extreme cold temperatures and that upcoming electric bills will increase by about 1/3.
