Approval of Minutes

Privilege of the Floor

Mr. Ted Rauber, President of the Spencerport Depot and Canal Museum and Mrs. Doreen Castano, Director of the Spencerport Depot and Canal Museum presented the Village Board with a picture of the Depot decorated for the holidays in 2013 in appreciation of the Village for the- work that they do to support the Depot.

Mr. Rauber added that the Depot entertains about 2500 visitors per year.

Mr. Grassi of Coventry Drive urged the Village to do a cost analysis of the annexation of the Village Pines property and have taken into account all aspects of the annexation.

Mrs. Joan Quigley, Maplewood Avenue questioned if anyone has heard that the Village Plaza is being sold.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell confirmed that Mrs. Quigley meant Village Plaza, not Village Woods Plaza, which has a new owner, and is undergoing renovation.

B. Other (Drainage, Franchise)

Superintendent West commented that in regards to the Maplewood Avenue drainage issue, it was determined by MCWA that the water is not caused by a water main leak and Jeff Netzband, engineer from Foundation Design suggested that the Village take a water sample from each home and the catch basin to test the fluoride levels to rule out municipal water.

Superintendent West continued that he will be taking a water sample and Mr. Netzband also suggested that the Village determine when they stopped drawing water from the local springs for water supply and that in 1966 there were no cattails in the area and that could be a contributor to the drainage issues.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell questioned Superintendent West as to how the residents have been informed of the findings by the engineer.

Superintendent West responded that he has been in contact with Mary and Ed Wiedo and that he and Mayor Granger have been over to the area.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell confirmed that the residents know that Mr. Netzband will be at the Workshop Meeting.

Superintendent West responded that they are aware of the meeting.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell suggested that the Village receive a more formal report from MCWA regarding the Maplewood Avenue drainage issue.

Superintendent West indicated that he will ask MCWA for more information.

A. Fire Department

Trustee Penders commented that the IMA for fueling at the DPW has been presented to the board.

B. Police

Trustee Penders indicated that a permit has been submitted to NYS DOT for the relocation of the cross walk on Union Street from the north of Amity Street to the south of Amity Street.

C. Ambulance

Trustee Penders indicated that the signed IMA has been received by the Village.

-Mayor Granger questioned what the plan is for the 9/11 ceremony due to their being problems previous years.

Trustee Penders responded that a few years ago there were issues with prayers that were said at the event and following the ceremony there was vandalism on the Exempts Club and St John's Church. At this time the fire department is the lead agency and that the event is more a military event than a first responders event.

Mayor Granger asked Mr. Stowe his thoughts.

Mr. Stowe responded that the Village should not be involved with the event.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell commented that the fire department should handle the entire event.

Clerk Sullivan questioned who will be organizing the event.

Mayor Granger responded the fire department will take care of it.

Clerk Sullivan explained that the previous Mayor took a very active role in coordinating the event.

Mayor Granger indicated that he would talk to the President of the Fire Department, Sal Muniz.

Ms. Cordts questioned if there has been any consideration of no left turns at Amity and Union Streets.

Trustee Penders responded that left turns are not the issue; the issue is more the placement of the cross walk.

Mayor Granger commented that six (6) applications have been received for the vacant Trustee position and that he would like to do interviews as a group.

For background: Village of Spencerport began attending meetings in 2012, regularly contributing to the Sustainability Workgroup. FLREDC consists of diverse participants from Monroe County, adjacent and related counties: Genesee, Livingston, Ontario, Orleans, Seneca, Wayne, Wyoming and Yates. At the session today, Co-Chairs Joel Seligman and Danny Wegman and Executive Director Vincent Esposito updated over 100 attendees.

Previously the Council identified categorized Workgroups who established criteria, collected projects, then prioritized, ranked and recommended lists for consideration by the Scoring Committee. The semi-final Progress Report and Review were presented. Overall, this is a competition among ten New York State multi-county regions that submit results in Round IV CFA 2014 for money/New York State resources available as announced by Governor Cuomo. Suggestion: Heritage Trail signage with symbols, picnic table & grill – locate in Trolley Depot vicinity – amenities appear to be underutilized

Superintendent West responded that he will get signs indicating the amenities on the trail.

Green Initiatives – Trustee Nellis-Ewell, Chair

Trustee Nellis-Ewell commented that the electric vehicle charging station is installed.

Superintendent McIntee indicated that the charging station is installed, but not operational, however, it will be by the end of the week when final inspections are complete.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell indicated that because we installed the charging station the Village is now a stakeholder in the Genesee Region Clean Communities.

Superintendent McIntee indicated that the Village will receive a \$1000 grant for the charging station.

Trustee Penders questioned the safety of the charging station.

Superintendent McIntee responded that it acts like an extension cord for the vehicles.

Village Clerk – Jacqueline Sullivan

Clerk Sullivan commented that the Village will be receiving \$2800 for replacement of the (3) benches that were stolen from the trail.

Clerk Sullivan commented that NYCOM Fall training school is the week of September 15th and is open to Board members to attend as well. Clerk Sullivan continued that the agenda is similar to last year's agenda and that staff would like to attend next year's training.

Clerk Sullivan indicated that electric collection agency inquired to pursue collection of an outstanding electric account via small claims court due to the individual being employed. Clerk Sullivan indicated that in the past the Village handled small claims court in house.

The Village Board indicated that they would like legal actions to be handled in house.

Superintendent of Public Works – Thomas M. West

Superintendent West commented that paving continues and that help was received from all surrounding towns and villages; drainage issues at 42 Nichols Street continue and that the Village will be responsible for the pipe connecting the catch basin to the easement line; work has started on drainage issues at Rt. 259 and Big Ridge Road by NYS DOT and a contractor will be called to attempt to eradicate the tree roots in the catch basin.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell questioned the status of the solar speed sign.

Superintendent West responded that it has been received and will be installed shortly.

Superintendent of Electric – Owen McIntee

Superintendent McIntee commented that work continues at the substation and underground upgrades in the Kirkgate area; awaiting information from NYSERDA regarding solar upgrades to the Village Office; there will be a LED light bulb give away at the office starting September 2nd that is funded through IEEP funds.

Trustee Penders questioned the status of the new bucket truck.

Superintendent McIntee responded that he has met with the design team at Altec and the truck is to be sent for production soon.

Attorney – Eric Stowe

Attorney Stowe commented that he has been working with Attorney Olson and Attorney Schum regarding Village Pines Annexation; an agreement has been made with Time Warner Cable regarding the updated franchise agreement.
