Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Mayor Penders, seconded by Trustee Hopson and carried that the minutes from the July 1, 2015 Village Board Meeting be approved as read.

A motion was made by Mayor Penders, seconded by Trustee Kuntz and carried that the minutes from the July 15, 2015 Village Workshop Meeting be approved as read.

Privilege of the Floor

Mr. Steve Liccardello, Home Pride Builders addressed the Village Board by updating them on the status of the Canal Landing housing project located at the end of West Avenue and Amity Street and explained that the recently enacted sewer hookup fee increase from \$500 - \$1500 is an unanticipated expense to his project and would like the Village Board to consider grandfathering his project in at the previous rate of \$500 since at this time he is the only developer actively building in the Village of Spencerport.

Mr. Liccardello added that he was required to upgrade the sewer pump station located within the project prior to any issuance of C of O's at a cost of approximately \$20,000. Mr. Liccardello indicated that the pump station did not need to be upgraded and submitted letters from Seiwert Equipment and LaDue Engineers indicating that the pump station would have worked as designed. This pump station is shared with the adjoining property to be developed.

Mayor Penders acknowledged his request and indicated that the Village Board would discuss this request at the August 19th workshop meeting.

Ms. Mary Guinan, Maplewood Avenue commented that she received a letter indicating that she has to purchase a refuse container. Ms. Guinan added that she was not able to attend the meeting and March and would like to know why this law was enacted. Ms. Guinan further explained that she does not need or have the room for a rolling refuse container and only has one small bag of trash.

Mayor Penders responded that the law was enacted to make trash pickup uniform and more efficient.

Ms. Guinan questioned the financial input to the Village for this program.

Mayor Penders and Trustee Nellis-Ewell responded that the Village is not making a profit on this program. Residents are charged the cost of the refuse cart.

Mr. Jones, Coleman Avenue added that he was unaware of the change and it is not necessary, he too only has a small amount of trash and does not want the large rolling refuse cart. Mr. Jones added that he would like to see it repealed.

Discussion ensued regarding the size of trash cans and various refuse situations.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell explained to Mr. Jones the code review committee process and it was determined that the change to this particular law was determined to increase efficiencies for future additional units and make for a safer work environment for the employees. Trustee Nellis-Ewell added that there were two public hearings and are advertised the Suburban News the Village's official newspaper.

Trustee Kuntz added that he was happy to purchase a refuse cart when he moved to the Village and this week he only had one bag of garbage in his cart.

Discussion ensued regarding offering smaller rolling refuse carts at a reduced costs and incentives to reduce trash.

Ms. Jean Colby, Nichols Street explained to the Village Board that the Bicentennial/Sesquicentennial committee would like to paint murals on each side of the CSX bridge abutments highlighting the Town and Village's anniversaries with the official flower (day lilies) and would like the Village's permission or if they are not the permitting agency a letter of support for the project. Ms. Colby continued by describing the paintings.

Trustee Nellis-Ewell asked if this project had been brought up to the committee.

Ms. Colby responded that it had been brought up to the committee a couple meetings ago.

Discussion ensued regarding the condition of the bridge and methods of painting.

Ms. Colby indicated that they would be approaching CSX for permission.

RESOLVED, that the Village Board, declares themselves as Lead Agency, hereby determines that the Proposed Action is a Type I Action pursuant to SEQRA; and be it further

RESOLVED, that based upon the Village Board's review of the Proposed Action, the materials provided by the Applicant and the comments received from the public on January 7, 2015 and all other materials submitted in connection with the application, the Village Board hereby determines that the proposed action will not result in significant adverse environmental impacts and hereby issues a negative declaration as to the Proposed Action pursuant to SEQRA.

Clerk Sullivan commented that the results of the speed sign on Maplewood Avenue from June 16 – July 23, 2015 indicated that there were over 4,000 vehicle passes and that 445 of those vehicle passes were speeding. Speeds were not over 40 MPH. Clerk Sullivan added that there are 40 properties that have not paid their taxes totaling \$55,000 before interest and penalties.

Superintendent of Public Works – Thomas M. West

Superintendent West commented that road work continues on Brockport Road, sidewalk and gutter work has been done throughout the Village; a top soil machine from Monroe County will be loaned to the Village to make top soil out of the leaf pile at the shop; storm water outfall inspections are being completed at this time and scheduling is taking place for the Gazebo roof replacement.

Superintendent of Electric – Owen McIntee

Superintendent McIntee addressed the annual Electric Fund audit indicating that net income is lower because of weather and income is made from base rates prior to supplemental power. Loads continue to be low due to weather at this time as well.
