194 South Union Street, Spencerport, New York 14559

Village Ice Cream Shop

Applicant operated Abbott's/Spencerport 2005-2011; five-year non-compete clause ended.

Applicant expects to open seasonal, walk-up only Village Ice Cream Shop Spring 2017.

Fenity Associates Architects plan retains front of building:

• Adds front deck (8 feet ×24 feet); material to be pressure-treated lumber, redwood-stained, with railing of square white spindles

• Handicapped accessibility by adding sidewalk that leads to/from existing street sidewalk

• Changes front windows to four white vinyl double-hung

• Adds decorative awnings of Brera Sorbet pattern

Green space in front to remain; later perhaps tables out front (check with Building Inspector)

Building may be re-sided later (color to complement awnings)

Cakes by Karen to occupy back of building

Businesses to use municipal parking; signs to be placed (Ogden Senior Center owns 6 feet from their parking lot north into grassy area)

Applicant to return (to ARB) for sign to be placed on peak of building Current sign posts to be removed

Disposition: Certificate of Appropriateness granted unanimously.

Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) Meeting of October 20, 2016

Pursuant to Chapter 340 of the Village of Spencerport, Public Hearing:

Application of Robert G. Male, 2 Jessica Lane, Spencerport, New York 14559

Special Permit to erect a 38 foot privacy fence on property located at 2 Jessica Lane; whereas a special permit from the Zoning Board of Appeals shall be required for a privacy fence pursuant to Chapter 340-32 A (4)(a) in a Residential R-2 District.

Applicant stated the proposed fence is to be of white vinyl. Fence purposes: to contain three dogs and to provide privacy for a hot tub. Applicant is a tenant who rents the property from Steve Licciardello (property owner). It was clarified: 1) property owner approves of the fence (special permit) and 2) fence stays with the property. It was stated no HOA (Homeowners' Association) is in effect yet, and therefore, no conditions thereof. Furthermore, that the property owner has to sign off on the building permit.
