- Kris Schultz reviewed proposed site plan for three-story building: apartments with retail.

- Kris Schultz presented responses to comments from DPW Superintendent West and (MRB) Engineer Willard (July 31, 2019.) Highlights:
 - 1. Shift all parking onto site at rear, using bollards, columns and wheel stops
 - 2. Address ADA accessibility (ramp) and parking (van-sized space) per ADA standards.
 - 3. Discuss parking partly covered at rear Considered a garage? NYS Building Code applies. Fire-retardant ceiling planned.
 - 4. Remove two trees, relocate as Village designates
 - 5. Maintenance person on site, to handle toters (no dumpster).
 - 6. Footprint change (smaller); now 62% lot coverage
 - 7. Basement to be storage for tenants, plus equipment and utility space
 - 8. Plowing on East Avenue; snow onto private property: "What Village typically has"
 - 9. Decide staging location in pre-construction meetings. Limited space on site. Lease in Village Plaza?
 - 10. Building could be 4/5 feet taller than adjacent building
 - 11. Curbing: "Any place Village has granite curbing retained, or saved"; per Comprehensive Plan, granite curbing. "Theirs to be concrete to match sidewalk".
 - 12. Storm sewer: per DPW Superintendent, some backup issues; catch basin to be moved slightly
 - 13. Water service potential relationship with neighbor to share cost
 - 14. Sanitary sewer access
 - 15. Adequate erosion control
 - 16. Lighting at entrances for safety; compatible and complementary with building design (ARB appearance)
 - 17. * To be no sidewalk closure, pedestrian tunnel passage along Union Street
