Mayor Penders updated the group on the court status for Grandpa Sam's that a date needs to be assigned but the matter will be heard in Sweden Town Court.

CEO Rich McQuilkin gave his monthly report outlining ongoing matters and letters that were sent out. 113 Nichols Street, excavating without a permit has been closed out and is all set; 223 Hilltop regarding trailers has made application to ZBA for 9/19 however the decision has been tabled; 58 N. Union Street pool has been filled in; 34 Lyell Avenue now has hot water and clean up continues; Hilltop Apartments all hydrants are now functioning with good flow; Letter generated for 120 Nichols Street for fence without a permit; Letter generated for 148 Lyell Avenue, pool without a permit (removed); Letter generated for 107 Thorncliff, pool without a permit (removed); letter generated for 148 Martha Street, 2 trailers; Letter generated for 65 Village Walk, 2 trailers and 1 unregistered vehicle; Letter generated for 100 Parkhurst, 2 trailers and scrap storage; Canal Days and German Fest inspections and Grandpa Sam's filed to NYS for their variance for the sprinkler system and that it would be approved for existing building. However, the wording from NYS did not address the fire separation between the restaurant and second floor. Grandpa Sam's indicated that they would be applying for a variance to NYS for the fire separation.

Attorney Stowe indicated that he continues to work on the Small Cell Local Law

**Discussion**

Kris Schultz, Schultz Associates distributed to the group a proposal and sketches for the N. Union Street property for engineering services and design for a proposed parking lot. Mr. Schultz continued that the property would accommodate up to 12 parking spaces along with other passive park attributes. The design would include a topographic ground survey, design of access and parking improvements grading and storm sewer improvement. The budget cost would be \$4,750.00.

Discussion ensued regarding amenities at the proposed parking lot.

Kris Schultz, Schultz Associates – 148 S. Union Street Development; Mr. Schultz indicated to the Village Board that the proposed development will need to remove two (2) healthy Village Trees and the developer is willing to replace in kind two (2) trees at the discretion of the Village. This would be included in the letter of credit for the development.

Discussion ensued regarding the overall project at 148 S. Union Street.

Temporary removal of 2 parking spaces on West Avenue north side at Martha Street – Mayor Penders – Mayor Penders indicated that a steak out has been conducted so that signs can be put in for no parking temporarily until the bridge is done.
