B1 Predicting the Future: Sustainable land use planning as the first step in the development of resilient communities. Sheila Hess, Conservation Connects, LLC

This will be an interactive workshop providing information, hands on experience, and resources to assist municipalities with sustainable land use planning. The Green Genesee/Smart Genesee project will serve as an example of land use planning and how it relates to the future of municipalities and the development of resiliency in our region. The workshop is split into the following three 50-minute sessions:
Session 1 - Reality Check
Session 2 - Map the Vision
Session 3 - The Implementation Game

C1 Zoning, Supersession and Gas Expiration and Middlefield Decisions, Daniel Spitzer, Esq. Partner, Hodgson Russ, LLP and Arthur J. Buckley, AICP, Wyoming County Planner

This session will discuss the implications of the recent Court of Appeals affirmation of the NY Supreme Court's finding that New York towns have the authority to ban oil and gas production activities, including hydrofracking, within their jurisdictions through the adoption of local zoning laws. (1 AICP CM credit pending, 1 AICP law credit pending)

C2 A Vision to Achieve and Maintain Waterbody Health across New York State, Jeff Myers, NYSDEC

The protection and enhancement of lakes, rivers and streams is best accomplished using a team approach that involves local partners, regional/watershed programs and state and federal agencies, and recognizes each agency's strengths. This approach also requires the integration of all components of Watershed Planning - assessment, strategy development, funding priorities and implementation - to create the best opportunity for success. NYSDEC Representatives will present a vision for how such coordination can achieve and maintain waterbody health, one waterbody at a time. (2 AICP CM credits pending)

B2 Climate Smart Communities and You: Options and Opportunities. Jim Yienger and Dazle Ekblad, Climate Action Associates, LLC

Climate Smart Communities is a partnership between the State of New York and local governments focused on helping communities reduce their greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to a changing climate. Offered at no cost to municipalities, the program has evolved in significant ways over the last five years, especially with the recent release of the new certification program. This presentation will give an overview of the program and describe the options and opportunities, using case studies from Climate Smart Communities across the state. (1 AICP CM credit pending)

C3 SEQRA Overview and the New Environmental Assessment Forms. Felipe Oltamari, AICP, CNUA, Genesee County Department of Planning

Local and state governments are subject to compliance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA). The first hour of this session is an overview of the SEQRA process, including a review of the regulations, classifying the action, and making a determination of significance. The second hour will focus on the new Environmental Assessment Forms (EAFs) in effect since October 7, 2013. (1.75 AICP CM credits pending)

B3 A Guidebook for Regional Upper Floor Revitalization, Tania Werbizky, Preservation League of NYS, Tom Kicior, G/FLRPC, Joe Fama, Troy Architectural Program, Daniel Mackay, Preservation League of NYS, Elise Johnson-Schmidt, Johnson-Schmidt and Associates, Architects, Rick Hauser, AIA, LEED AP, In-Site: Architecture, LLP, Andrew W. Meier, esq., Webster Schubel & Meier, LLP

Break

This session will provide an overview of the G/FLRPC & Preservation League collaborative project A Guidebook for Regional Upper Floor Revitalization. For years the upper floors of many of the regions' cities, villages and town centers have been deteriorating and experiencing increasing vacancy rates. This presentation will include information regarding opportunities and options for upper floor reuse; methods of overcoming obstacles to revitalization; building code challenges; funding options including historic tax credits; as well as case studies. (3 AICP CM credits pending)

C4 Shoreline Processes, Frank Sciremammano, RIT and Thomas Hailey, NYSDEC

This session provides an overview of the physical processes resulting in shoreline erosion on a large lake shoreline. This is followed by an introduction to the various structural and non-structural measures available to deal with it and the primary State and Federal regulations that govern such actions. (2 AICP CM credits pending)

A1 Planning Board Overview, NYSDOS
This basic course addresses the powers and duties of town, village, and city planning boards and commissions. The administrative and regulatory roles of the planning board, including its review of site plans, special use permits, and subdivision plats are discussed, along with the planning board's role in the municipal comprehensive plan. The importance of board procedures, referral to the municipal planning agency, and making findings are also covered. (2 hours CEO credit, 2 hours of CLE)

A2 White Elephants, NYSDOS
Are you herding white elephants in your community? What's to be done with those vacant or underused architectural gems like churches, armories, and depots? This course examines the socio-economic reasons for their vacancies, and land use tools that can help restore their rightful places as revitalizing neighborhood anchors. Before you issue that demolition permit, take note of these creative examples of adaptive re-uses. (1 AICP CM credit pending)

A3 Comprehensive Planning, NYSDOS
This session will include a discussion of the practical and legal benefits of adopting a comprehensive plan. Included are the importance of involving the public in the development of the plan—early on; strategies for compiling essential data to set the direction of the plan; plan contents; and steps leading to the adoption of a comprehensive plan. There will be a review of the comprehensive plan statutes as well. (1 hour CEO credit)

A4 Zoning Board of Appeals Overview, NYSDOS
This introductory course to the zoning board of appeals focuses on the statutory tests boards must follow to grant use and area variances and proper handling of zoning interpretations. Meeting procedures and notice requirements will also be discussed, along with the ZBA's relationship with enforcement officials and the planning board, and the importance of making good findings. (2 hours CEO credit, 2 hours of CLE)
